PASTOR'S CORNER

OUTREACH

Quick recap of 2020. We provided 16 Easter Baskets and a spring/summer outfit for the children in West Virginia. We also delivered several loads of used clothing, school supplies, new and used books for the Home School Library at the Church. At Christmas we were able to provide toys and some new clothing for 12 children and 3 bags of food for each of the families.

During the beginning of the pandemic two of us ladies we're able to make and donate 160 masks for Doctors and Nurses at Mercy Hospital. We also sold enough masks to donate almost \$600.00 to Carroll County Food Sunday. We are now selling toddlers, kids, preteen, and men's masks at church with all proceeds going to Carroll Food Sunday.

For Board of Child Care we were able to donate \$50.00 a month for Birthday presents and collected \$600.00 for Christmas presents. Do to the Pandemic the Board of Child Care requested money instead of us purchasing items from the angel tree.

We were able to stuff and ship 78 shoeboxes for Christmas Child. This was quite a feat since we had a month to collect and stuff the boxes due to the pandemic.

The Church also collected Food for a local family that was delivered before Christmas. Thanks to everyone who donated and helped with these projects.

For the month of February we will be collecting Tooth Brushes and Holders for shoeboxes. March we will be collecting Soap and Soap Holders. April we will be collecting water bottles or plastic glasses. This year we are trying to collect items each month. There will also be envelopes you can pickup to make a donation. Or add your donation to the weekly offering marking it on your envelope Xmas Child. Just \$1.00 here or there can make a difference.

The first 3 Weeks in March we will be collecting items for Easter baskets for the West Virginia Mission. A list of items needed, will provided in your weekly Bulletins.


West Virginia Family Update

In this newsletter I would like to highlight a teenage girl we helped for several years named Marlee. Marlee was 16 in 2015 when we got her on the Xmas list. She was very active in church helping with VBS, Sunday School just helping where ever needed. This girl was having a very hard time at home, helping take care of her grandfather and stepfather who just had a liver transplant. Her grandmother had just passed. Mom was working a lot of overtime to pay for the mounting medical bills. Marlee was left with all the household chores. Miss Fran took a Special interest and adopted Marlee for 2 Years. Marlee received a scholarship to WVU School of Nursing. The 1st year of school she did very well but the beginning of the second year, her grandfather passed. Just 3 months later her stepfather passed and Marlee quit school moved back home and went into a deep depression. Luckily, she received some great help from a Psychologist which got her back on track. Marlee and her Mom moved halfway between her Mom's job and college. Marlee is now enrolled in a Psychology program, she wants to help other kids like she was helped. She has told Cara (minister's wife) numerous times how much not just the Xmas presents, school supplies and college dorm items we sent meant to her, but just knowing that someone cared when she was overwhelmed. Marlee is now doing well in school and her part time job.



HERITAGE CORNER

OUR FORGOTTEN HISTORY

Here at Oakland, we are privileged to be a part of local history. Our "old church" was built around 1860 as part of a growing community. It served many Methodist Episcopal families. It was built on land donated by William and Cecelia Beam and funded by local members of the community.

The beautiful stained-glass windows were donated by folks like the Melville's, Parkers, Brandenburg's and one window bears the name of the Reverend Thomas Wood.

As part of a county wide article, the latest newsletter of the Historical Society of Carroll County featured our historical church on the cover.

As your Historian, I bring you this information at this time, because I believe our history has been forgotten, or slowly slipping away.

For the last several years, the building has been used as a flea market for our annual Bazaar.

The pulpit where preachers delivered God's holy word is now piled with flea market items. The altar rail where babies were baptized, children were confirmed, and couples united in marriage is now piled with boxes and items waiting for sale. The altar chairs where clergy sat, are tossed aside in the "slave gallery".

I recently sent a written note to the church council to request a clean out of this sacred place so that we can once again celebrate our heritage. The council discussed hosting a Spring flea market that will dispose of more items, but no plans were made for a full clean out.

While I like a good flea market as I'm sure you do too, using this historic building as a storage shed, year after year, is slowly burying our past, I pray that our collective eyes will be opened soon, and we will be able to see where our ancestors knelt in prayer and paved the way for us to do the same.
